Vic Weatherall played his way through the Oshawa Minor Hockey system and went on to play for the Legionnaires, winning the OHA championship in 1982-83 and was named the league's best defenceman on two occasions.

After graduating from McMaster University, where he also played, Weatherall went on to work for EDS in software sales and played hockey in the

"Vic was a great team guy, he was always the first one in the dressing room before games and the last one to leave," says Andrew Williams, a friend and league spokesman. "In addition to his great play on the ice, Vic always had the guys laughing with his fun sense of

humour."
